G.B. Stern



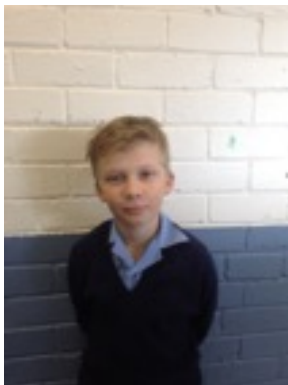
Saying Thank you – it's everyday etiquette and a simple courtesy that takes just a moment. It costs nothing, not even effort.
