in the skill sessions with enthusiasm.

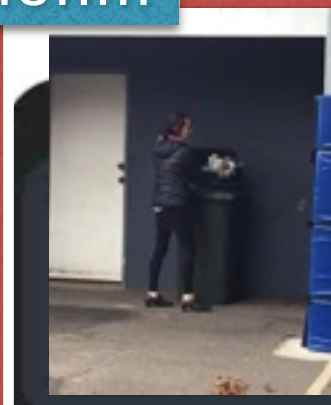

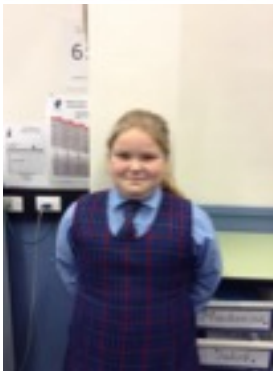
Mrs Plummer putting rubbish in the bin that she picked up - exemplary role model
